“ I wish I could relate funny stories that I remember, like the others can, but my memory doesn't grant me the luxury of detailed stories, just random snippets here and there. Make no mistake, that does not mean that I don't remember that you and Jay basically saved me at one of the toughest times in my life. I was so unhappy at the Academy and so far out of my comfort zone. If Rob and the others had not brought me to you all, I am sure that my Academy story would be much different than how it turned out.

You all opened your home to all of us, but it meant so much to me to have that escape and be able to relax and laugh. That was what made it so much fun with you all, how much you emphasized having fun and laughing. You made a home away from home for me and gave me the feeling that I belonged to a family. I loved it. I loved talking with you all, getting advice, watching Jonathan grow, laughing at the antics of the boys, and just being in such a welcoming environment. It was such a stark contrast to the rigidity and seriousness of school.

You all let me be me and helped me laugh at my quirks. I remember always having to make cookies to get my sugar fix and venting to you about whatever was happening at school. You always were a great listener and sounding board. I love how you asked thoughtful questions and made me think more about a situation based on those questions, you did it right up to our last conversation, despite how you were feeling. I love that you were not afraid to ask anything, you didn't beat around the bush. There are a lot of lessons there for me that I am still trying to take on board. You exemplify the kind of person we should all learn something from; be passionate, honest, and true to yourself!

In some ways I bet you understood me better than I understood myself when I was at school. You inspired me in our last talk with your humor and honesty. I hope that I can grow into the strength you have demonstrated over the years. You were always there for ALL of us, no matter what stresses you had going on in your life and you worried more about others than you did yourself. I cannot thank you enough for your compassion, care and the example that you set. Your courage was so strong and you weathered so much over

*the time that we knew you, yet you always found a way to smile and laugh and make the most of out of life, you give me something to strive for and teach my own children.*

*I loved you dearly, as did all of the others that you helped at the Academy. You brought joy to our lives made us laugh and cared for us like your own children. Jonathan was gracious to share you with all of us and we are all better for our time with you. You were and still are a treasure and you taught us all to be more resilient and stronger with your actions. Keeping your humor intact shows the strength of character that you had. Thank you for being you and for opening your home and heart to us, you have forever changed all of our lives for the better.*
