“ Carol Renae Matz was born 3/21/54, the youngest of three children to Frank and Lottie Matz. She was an adorable, free-spirited child with dark eyes and curls, who always seemed to be happy and smiling. Carol loved flowers, and as a little girl she would go down the block picking flowers from all the neighbors' front yards to bring home to her Mom or the old lady next door. She made friends easily and held onto them over the years, including some from as far back as grammar school. She loved animals and had pet fish as a child, then a full aquarium as an adult. She also loved birds and had an impressive aviary built in her living room for her pet finches, and recently adopted a beautiful German Shepard named Deja.

An avid photographer from the days of film cameras, she learned the craft from Uncle Ted, a friend of the family who was also her godfather. She had many albums full of photos—of her travels, of flowers, nature, friends and family. Her sister Gloria liked to tease that Carol "looked like a tourist" with all of the photography gear around her neck at every family gathering, but years later we can all appreciate the wonderful moments and scenes she captured.

After he returned from Vietnam, her tall, dark and handsome brother Frankie taught her how to drive a car, while her girlfriends all swooned in envy. She was very close with her sister Gloria and relocated to stay close several times, from Chicago to Berwyn, and later to Woodridge.

Carol enjoyed working in offices, as a secretary, and later in employment agencies, where she earned the title of Job Order Queen, getting the most orders and placements of anyone, connecting countless people with jobs over the decades. She worked on commission and made a good living in this tough business, thanks to her wonderful people-skills, phone skills, and knack for making connections.

She loved to travel, and after her father died she accompanied her Mom (and a bunch of other older folks) on group bus trips with

*Pastor Nylander, trekking all over the country and documenting it all with her camera. Colorado held a special place in her heart, and her travels also took her as far as Alaska, Mexico, the Caribbean, and the redwoods of northern CA.*

*Carol seemed to know everyone in the neighborhood and could strike up a conversation with anybody. Her warmth and compassion were always on display, like when she'd compliment lonely-looking old women in restaurants on their hair or outfits, help out homeless people downtown, or ask for the manager of a restaurant every time she'd had good service, to let them know what a great job the waitress had done.*

*She loved dancing and also enjoyed garage sales, visiting family in Michigan, good times on the beach at Covert Park with her cousins Jimmy and Jackie, giving wonderful guided tours of Chicago to her country-bumpkin relatives, reading Sidney Sheldon novels, and watching the butterflies and wildlife from her beautiful home in Punta Gorda.*

*Carol took great care of her parents in their old age, having Lottie come and live out the last years of her life with her, putting her own life and plans on hold in order to provide compassionate, round-the-clock care. She never married, but Larry Clark has been her beloved companion for the last 30 years and they complimented each other well, recently realizing their dream of making a home together in Florida.*

*How she made me feel whenever we'd talk: Even when I was young, I would feel heard, appreciated, and like what I was saying really mattered to her. She had such a warmth about her personality. You couldn't help but feel loved and accepted when in her presence.*
