“ *I, a member of Apostles Lutheran Church in Melrose Park, IL would often take Dave home to his apartment after the Divine Service. The last I spoke with him was on June 21, 2017, in his room at Gottlieb Hospital. There, he was, laying still, staring ahead, and resigned to being fed intravenously. After some "small talk," I asked him if he remembered that he became a Lutheran Christian at Walther Lutheran High School. His countenance became relaxed, eyes fixed on the memory of that day, and with a smile, he responded with an unhesitating and resolute "Yeah!" That day at Walther had been a turning point for Dave, when he began taking God at His Word and acting according to it. Having heard and been convinced by what he learned through Luther's Small Catechism, that he was a sinner "in thought, word and deed," and in need of forgiveness, and that his Savior was Jesus, faith began and grew, beginning there at Walther Lutheran High School in Melrose Park, and subsequently, at Apostles Lutheran Church in Melrose Park, where, Sunday after Sunday, he heard the Gospel of forgiveness in Christ proclaimed. Though he struggled with advancing weakness, and falling, he would continue to respond similarly, ("Yeah!") unhesitating and resolutely, to any conversation concerning faith in Jesus.*
