“ Hello Ates, hope you two and the rest of the Algura family are doing good. Condolence sa pagkamatay ni Tatay Algura. Wala akong gaanong maalala kasi maliit pa ako noon pero I'm very sure that he was a very good person/father to all of you.

*My uncle from Corona, brother ni Tatay Pat ay may message na pinadala. Kung pwede ko raw i send sa inyo, here it is. Take care everyone. Thank you*

*"TO THE CHILDREN OF MR HOSPICIO ALGURA:*

*I received with sorrow the news about the passing away of your Father. because about 3 or 4 months ago I received a call from him and he sounded so normal in his voice and I could not notice anything that would make me think that he was not okay. That is why I was very surprised and I could not quite believe that he was gone.*

*I was only 17 years old and fresh from high school when I knew your Father when I joined the Philippine Air Force Band in 1951. He was one of the five Bicolano boys in the band. I dont know if you guys know Magencio Doroin, Greg Sernande, Sebastian Lagrimas and I cannot remember the name of the 4th one who I think still lives in the Airmen's Village at Villamor Air Base. Anyway of the five, I am close to your Father because my brother has a house in Airmen's Village and the house is close or near your Father's house. And every time I visited my brother at the Airmen's Village, I could see you kids while you were still little. But that was a long time ago and I dont think I would be able to recognize you when I meet you. When your Father was still in Long Beach, California, he visited me while we were still living in Los Angeles but now we are here in Corona, California. That was the only time when I saw your Father but while in Chicago I also tried to call him when I had the chance.*

*Our life in the Philippine Air Force Band was not that hard compared*

*to the other military personnel in the service because as musicians we just practise and we dont practise the whole day. So when we practise in the morning, we were quite relaxed in the afternoon. As I mentioned above your Father is quite close to me because of the fact that the children of my brother, Pat, know all of you I suppose and also because the husband of my younger sister was from Bicol also and that is why I seemed to get along with the Bicolano members of the PAF Band, and especially of course your Father. Since we moved to the US, I saw your Father only once while here in the US. You see I like to see my former friends and it is sad to know that your Father passed away.*

*I will always remember your Father and the memories of our friendship will have a big place in my heart. I hope I will have the opportunity to see you all someday.*

“ Papa’s Word of Remembrance

*Papa was a modest man with modest dreams. His biggest dreams were not anchored on fame and glory.*

*Unlike many of his generation, papa’s biggest dream was not to go abroad and make lots of money for himself.. His greatest aspiration was to build a strong and united family in the midst of the challenges then posed for providing his family and sending them to school .making sure that he is always around to give his children the experience – the grace – of his parenting.*

*For me and my siblings, that was the only role of papa that mattered to us. And he truly lived it, with honor and distinction.*

*I can still distinctly remember how he reacted when he learned that I had decided to marry Milo. I was very young then and I had not yet finished college. I could feel that this was of great concern to him – that I had not completed my studies and that other priorities may now hinder me from completing my degree. He said he knew that I enjoyed studying, and so he offered in sending me back to school. I gave him a promise – and I kept it – and with the fulfillment of having obtained a degree, was also the happiness I felt, seeing how proud he was when I, his bunso, finally graduated.*

*Even when we were already here in the United States, he continued to ask whether or not I was going to practice my profession in dentistry. It was a rhetorical question from him,that sometimes I would just ignore him because of guilt.*

*Every child looks up to his or her father as a man of strength and courage, a man who has all the answers, a man who can get through any tough situation. I saw Papa through what I think was his biggest trial and challenge – when Mama suffered from Alzheimer’s disease. It was a tough episode in our family’s life, including us*

*children. But he took on the responsibility of taking care of a wife whose memories of him and her family were gradually but surely being erased by the disease. I would see him sob quietly as he patiently took care of Mama 24/7 for many years before she passed away. In those years, probably more than at any other time, I saw Papa as a man who truly loved his wife and made his family the center of his life. My Mama was so lucky to have him for a husband, and we his children are fortunate to have him as our father – a true model for all of us.*

*I was deeply touched when I saw him crying in the hospital room when Milo fell ill a couple of years ago. Even now, I can see in my mind his loving presence as he took Milo's arm to assist him while walking even if he himself was already old and weak and could hardly walk himself. But that was really the kind of person Papa was – always thinking of others before himself, always ready to lend a hand, figuratively and physically.*

*Not too long ago, on his hospital bed, he said “Bahala na kayo sa isa't isa” (You take care of each other). At another time before, he told me “Ikaw na ang bahala kay Nonoy” (You take care of Nonoy). I hadn't the faintest idea they were to be his dying wish.*

*There was just nothing unnatural about his wish. I had heard him say those words many times over in behalf of other family members, but I just didn't realize that it was to be his last.*

*And I suppose we can all continue to embrace the grace of his loving presence in our lives by taking care of each other. Goodbye Papa! The memory of your love and kindness, the lessons you left us by the example of your life, will forever be treasured in our hearts!*

*Be with Mama, now. Bahala na kami sa isa't isa – but continue to inspire and guide us, as you had in life.*

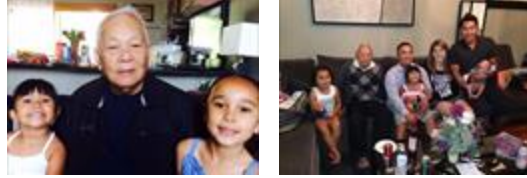
