



Mr. James P. Banks of North Barrington

January 2, 1944 - April 28, 2024

James “Jim” Patrick Banks, age 80, passed away Sunday, April 28, 2024 peacefully in his home. He was the beloved Uncle of Linda (Ron) Baum, Judith Brown, Deborah (Sid) DeLair and Janice (Joe Santella) Bissell. Jim is survived by many nieces, nephews and life-long friends.

Jim was born January 2, 1944 in Chicago, IL. The son of the late Edward Banks and the late Mary Banks.

After graduating from the University of Miami, Jim began his career at Automatic Data Processing (ADP), quickly becoming its youngest Division President.

In 1992, he transitioned from the corporate world to entrepreneurship, founding Interactive Health Solutions (IHS) in his garage. In 2015, he retired as IHS’s Chairman, leaving behind a legacy as a pioneer in early disease detection and workplace wellness. In 2018, The James Banks Foundation was founded to provide financial support and loyal partnership to animal welfare organizations around the world. Jim’s true passion, a fondness for animals spanning his lifetime, lives on through the hundreds of organizations he will support in the future.

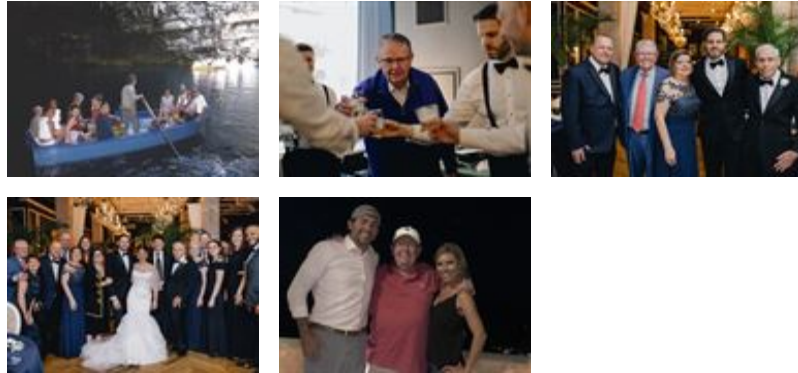

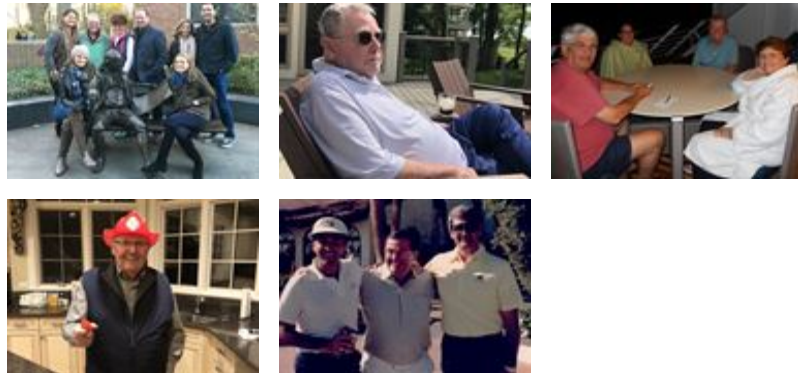
