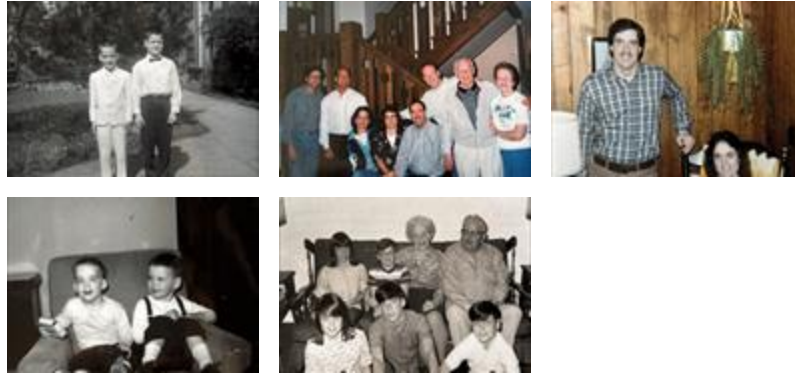

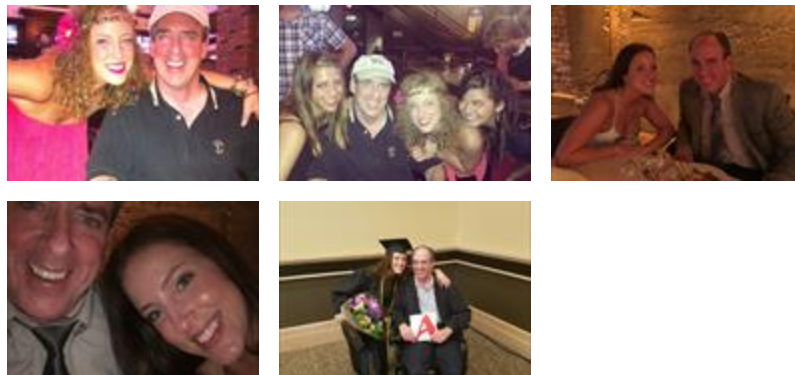

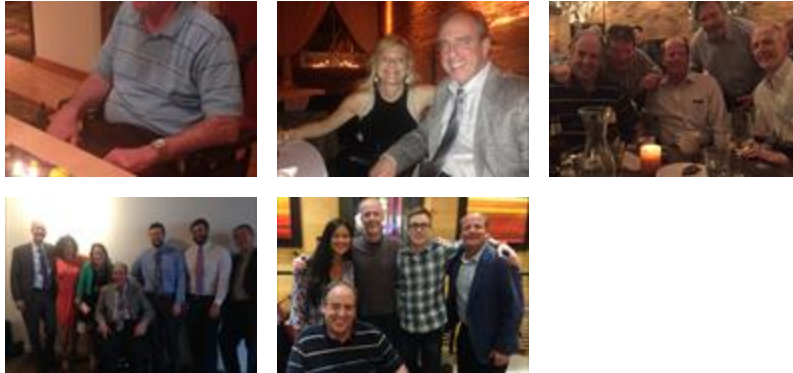

“My brother Jim was, simply put, a beautiful man and devoted disciple of Christ. When I was a kid, sometimes he would take me along when he was running errands, and I remember how nice he was to everyone he met. A gas station attendant, fast food cashier, any complete stranger, it didn't matter. He'd greet them with a hearty “how ya doin' today?!”. That is just who he was, and he stayed the same through his entire life.

Jim was born at Mercy Hospital in Buffalo, NY in June of 1954. He spent his early years in Buffalo until Dad moved the family to Livonia, MI to work at Ford headquarters. Jim embraced the change and just recently told again me how much he still loved Michigan and would love to live there if circumstances permitted.

He graduated from The University of Michigan at Dearborn and went on to have an incredibly successful career in the steel business. First at Mitsui, a Japanese company, then with stops in Pittsburgh and finally Chicago. His incredible personality and true desire to humbly serve his clients led to great sales success.

He always loved University of Michigan sports, especially football. I loved talking to him about the Wolverines' chances or how they played last week. We'd also talk about how the Red Wings might do in the coming year. He had a Michigan block “M” painted for me as a gift, and it still hangs proudly in my den.

Jim's love of family was deep. He literally was like a kid traveling to Michigan for Thanksgivings to see everyone. He couldn't wait. He loved his three children with the sacrificial kind of love any parent should aspire to have.

Jim was a profile of courage. He was very athletic. He and I used to play basketball on the driveway for hours...first one to 100 wins. He was an excellent softball player, proudly representing the Wintergarden Bar in his earlier years. He and I used to play tennis at his mother-in-law's apartment complex. Then, in the mid 1980s

he was diagnosed with MS. He battled it courageously for 40 years and beat the odds in so many ways. As much as it hurts to lose him, when I picture him restored to full wholeness and glory it gives me consolation.

Jim was a man of faith. When I was in college, he sent me a Bible with a letter and it helped to kickstart my own journey of faith. His prayer was powerful, and there are many stories of how the Lord heard and answered his prayers to the benefit of his family and friends.

Jim, you ran the race well...I'm sure you have been greeted by Christ with "well done, my good and faithful servant". While we are all hurting, it is comforting to know that you are joined once again with Mom and Dad. Please pray for us and soak up your rich rewards in Heaven. I love you brother.
