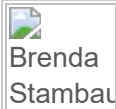

“ My mother was 52 years old when Dr. Bob confirmed the existence of a very large malignant tumor in her breast. It needed to be shrunk with chemo before he could even operate. I had been living overseas and timed a long trip home to coincide with the surgery. By the time I met him, my mother had told me how fabulous he was, like a gazillion times. I remember instantly adoring him too. He seemed genuinely interested in Mom’s life, he knew so much about me and my brothers. He asked me about my work and about my boyfriend at the time. (Dr. Bob would later come up with a special name for that rather unpopular boyfriend)

After the surgery, Dr. Bob’s work was done but Mom had a long road of chemo and radiation ahead. He went no where, regularly checking in with her and with me.

Four years later Mom called to say she thought her cancer was back, she’d been losing weight and her stomach was full of fluid. She went into the hospital and never got to come home again. Doctors discovered her entire liver riddled with cancer. They treated her for three weeks, one round of chemo, then a battle to get her strong enough for another.

Even though she was under the care of her oncologist, we’d see Dr. Bob nearly every day. He visited to brighten her day and to help us understand the horror that was unfolding, taking us through her labs, explaining what things meant and what to watch out for. My brothers and I were in our 20s, this was our first experience with cancer. We were totally overwhelmed.

I’ll never forget lying in Mom’s hospital bed with her, surrounded by family when Dr. Bob came into the room and like a child she looked up at him and asked for his honest opinion. He said, “you’re pretty sick girl” and she knew. In the preceding days, I remember having to ask the other doctors to stop making it so obvious that she was going to die. They were trying to prepare us, but the honesty felt brutal and I didn’t want anyone but Dr Bob to give her that message.

I also remember him telling my brothers and I to “love her to death”. Watching her suffer and ultimately lose her battle was the most excruciating, heartbreaking experience of our lives. Dr. Bob did everything he could to support us, even convincing hospital bosses not to give my mom a roommate, so I could keep running the place like a fancy hotel suite, inviting regular visitors to cheer her up.

I later learned that Mom asked Dr Bob to keep in touch with me. That’s when I became a kind of adopted daughter. I went back to England and to my job as an anchor on Bloomberg. Dr. Bob would watch my shows that aired in the middle of the night in Chicago and send me notes about my hair or outfit that day. Hilarious?! He sent his wife and daughter whom I hardly knew to London. They ended up staying with me and the three of us had the most unforgettable time! Telling guys trying to “chat us up” at the bar that we were sisters and laughing after discovering Sharon’s virgin mojitos weren’t so pure.

When my father died two years after Mom passed, the Rosenblooms were there for me once again. Dr. Bob putting a call into the golf club where we hosted a memorial lunch, asking the owners to take good care of us. The next year when I got my job at ABC News and Good Morning America in NY Sharon threw a party. When I got married Bob presented me with a diamond bracelet he’d picked out himself. He noticed every time I wore it on TV. He texted regularly and I’d try to stop by the house on trips back to Chicago.

I am planning a long trip home this summer and was so looking forward to talking with Bob about some big life questions I’ve been grappling with. I prayed his health would improve and we’d be able to have some fun on his spectacular backyard deck. I was excited to see him walk Raia down the aisle next year. Like my parents, he’s gone way too soon.

If you can hear me Dr. Bob, thank you for keeping your pledge to my mom. My pledge to you is to keep in touch with your family as you did with me. I will also try to live more like you did, without

reservation when it comes to love. Even if it means suffering the pain of loss like this again and again. Sharon, Raia and Joe....I'm afraid there's no getting rid of me! X Linzie

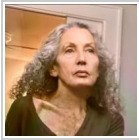
