What started as a new IEP system tutorial led to hours of conversation about all the trials and tribulations of being a single parent, looking for love in all the wrong places, and navigating our new roles together as co-assistant directors.*

*3. You. Loved. Being. A. Dad. You loved being Noah and Emilia's Dad. I pray that the memories you made with them will never be lost in the years that were taken too soon from them.*

I will miss calling your extension, even though we were three doors down from one another, just to have you pick up and say, "This is Ryan. I already know I can't help you." I will miss the gifs and memes that we'd message each other during meetings, just so I could see you crack a smile when we were supposed to be acting serious and paying attention. I will miss "getting in trouble" with you for staying way too late at work, and you making me text you when I got to my car and again when I got home.*

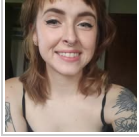

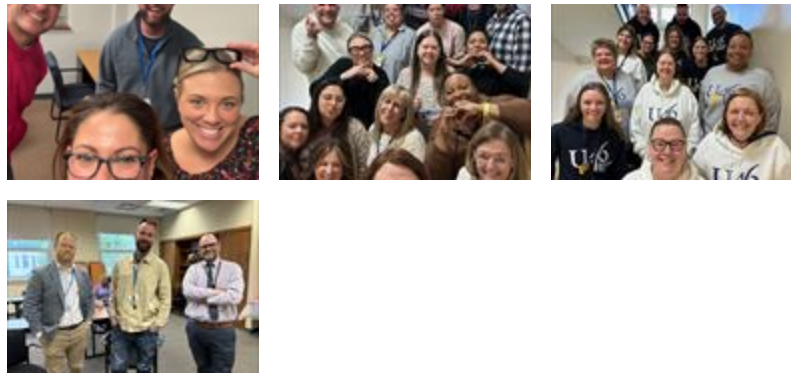
