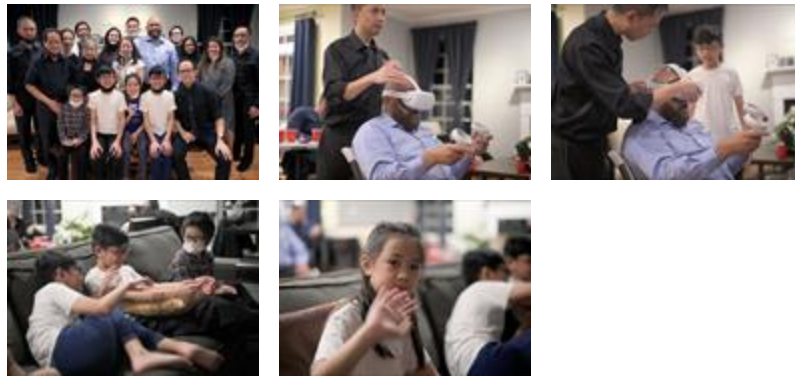

My Nanay, my Mother, who taught me to be independent, brave and how to be a good mother to my own children.

Virginia Satorre Castelo, my Nanay and my best friend, may you now rest in peace.



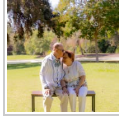
